Our hot lunch program is a great asset to our school. Here's how it works: Parents prepare and serve a hot meal for the children; the children who want the lunch being offered, pay \$2.50. The lunch profits go to the parents' tuition account. Everybody is happy—kids who eat, parents who don't have to make lunches, and parents who earn money for their tuition. To keep the financial transaction simple, kids give their hot lunch money to their teachers. The office exchanges the cash for a lunch ticket and credits the correct tuition account. Kids have their favorite menus and their favorite lunch providers.

One morning, a little girl came into her classroom pouting in her dramatic fashion. "I'm going to have hot lunch. My baba [big brother] is supposed to pay." The teacher told her that would work out just fine.

"But I only have fifty cents for extras."

"Just put it in your pocket."

"But I'm supposed to have hot lunch. My baba is supposed to pay."

Here was a lunch this little girl wasn't going to miss. Eventually, the assurances of the teacher settled the child.

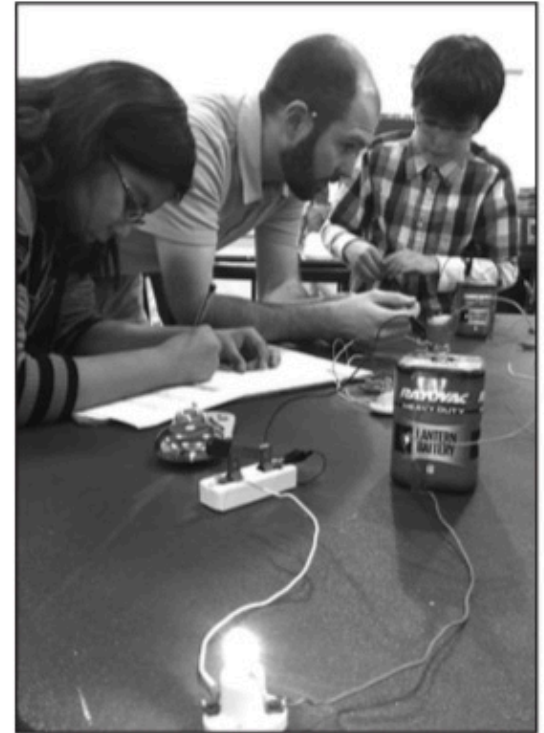
At lunchtime, the teacher distributed lunch tickets—none for the little girl. Instantly, she was in 'a state': "I'm supposed to have hot lunch! My baba is supposed to pay!" Again the teacher consoled her, "Don't worry. We'll check at the office." And, of course, at the office, there was a lunch ticket reserved for the child. "See," the teacher said, handing her the longed-for prize, "There was no need to push the panic button." The girl wailed, "But I already *did!*"

I have my own panic moments—you probably do too. Mostly, we hide the drama behind the façade of adulthood, but inside, it can be pretty lively. Times where we anticipate a crisis. Times when we worry. Times of anxiety and fear. But always, always, walking alongside our anxious thoughts is the comforting voice of Jesus reminding us, "Don't be afraid. I am with you....Everything works for the good of my children... Don't be anxious; your heavenly Father knows what you need...."

In God's time, we find out that He was right. There was no need to push the panic button. And, like the little girl, we have to confess, "But I already did!" Then we find ourselves forgiven—able to enjoy all the good that God pours into our lives. This is the Gospel we share with the children at ZCMS. This is the Gospel they sometimes unknowingly share with us.
